Adaptive Equipment UNPLUGGED

With advances in adaptive equipment, specifically in electronics, even clients with severe and complex physical limitations are capable of independent driving. However, the availability and cost of these adaptations may exceed the resources of those clients who could benefit most. Balancing the needs of the client while containing cost is an important aspect of the driver rehabilitation specialist's job. This presentation will explore the variety of adjustments and refinement that can be applied to mechanical devices to facilitate independent driving.

Learning Objectives:

1. Attendees will be able to identify two applications of the principles of lever and forces to hand controls to maximize client's capabilities.
2. Attendees will identify 1 advantage and 1 disadvantage of each mechanical hand control presented.
3. Attendees will be able to identify 2 possible adjustments of force and stroke for each basic style of mechanical hand controls.
4. Attendees will be able to identify the importance of steering device style and placement to maximize client mechanical advantage for steering.
5. Attendee will be able to demonstrate adjustment of the left accelerator pedal.
